<u>Reflection</u>

How many times will I begin my report referring to the effects of Covid on our year and how it has affected our growth. Yet I believe that Covid has done more to build the church than to tear it down. It has established a resolve within the church that we are not going let this virus destroy our faith and God's church. So, where does that lead us and how has that affected us here in Ryot?

How have we grown, physically, emotionally, and especially, how have we grown spiritually? After all is said and done and we look to the future, it is how we have grown in the past year that will affect how we will be able to grow in the year to come. How have we fulfilled our call to be disciples of Jesus Christ; how have we been discipled and how have we discipled others? How have we been evangelistic in our efforts? Finally, how have we engaged in fellowship? You see I continue to come back to these three elements to gauge or progress. How have we engaged with each other here at the church? How have we participated and engaged in the ministry with other churches? Finally, how have we been engaged with those from outside our faith communities in fellowship.

As I consider these things; these ideas and questions, I also consider the passages of Paul to the church in Corinth. Passages that speak of the grace we have received and the things we are able to do through God's grace. Paul writes, "*Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.*^{2 Corinthians 4:15}"

Experiencing Growth

It is easy to look around at our circumstances and see only the negative. I have to admit that I do struggle with this often. But in my doom and gloom, I am also reminded that it is through the grace of Jesus Christ that we are able to pull out of the negative an find the positive things that are going on. Growth can be hard to measure; how each of us has grown this past year is only able to be measured by you. Consider your spiritual growth, the ways in which you have matured in your Christian walk. The ways you have learned to put aside our worldly ways and seek the Lord's hand in guidance.

As in the past, the only statistics I can share this year are the ones where people actually walked through our doors. As attendance is measured this past year, we have had 104 individuals who are considered part of our church family attend services. This number is down by 6 individuals. Of these 104 persons, 57 have attended over 60% of the services. Now we have counted when you are not able to attend due to illness or work but have watched the livestream or recording of the service online. With this in mind, I encourage you to leave a comment letting us know who is watching on line so we can determine a more accurate reflection of those attending services.

We also have had over 145 individual visitors participate in our services, averaging 12 visitors per service. Some of these are in person; but many others have attended on line. Some have become a part of our church family, while others participate on special occasions and holidays. I encourage each of you, take time to welcome those who come to our church. Our social media exposure continues to fluctuate. In my best assessment, this is due to the inconsistency of our services streaming through completely to the end of the service. I estimate that we lose many people when our livestream is interrupted due to glitches in our connection. My prayer is that we can establish a better connection and obtain better tools and equipment to do this. We continue to offer our Sunday School but we have seen a decline in the number of persons attending from 60 to 49 individuals with a weekly average of 32 people in attendance. Celebrate recovery holds their group meetings on Monday evenings. We hold prayer meetings on Wednesday at 12:30, averaging 7 persons for these meetings. We continue to offer small groups on Wednesday evenings. During these evenings, the teens continue to meet, the children meet with Marie, Celebrate Recovery step studies meet in the basement and those who meet in the sanctuary have watched the television series The Chosen and have discussed what we can learn from these episodes. In the weeks to come beginning January 18th we will begin watching the latest season of The Chosen and discuss them.

We continue to offer our fellowship and evangelism opportunities. The first Friday of each month we meet at Denny's in Bedford for a time of fellowship and breakfast. We continue to offer craft nights on the third Thursday of each month, and the fourth Friday of each month we offer our family fun night, bring a game, a snack to share, and join us for some conversation and fun. We also plan to hold our kindness outreaches this coming year. We plan to have at least two gas buydowns; where we pay \$0.50 for each gallon of gas that is purchased over the course of 1 hour. We continue to get a lot of attention from this but our goal is to let people know we care. We have planned dollar drops, where we take dollar bills wrapped around cards and hiding them in the dollar stores and grocery stores in our area. We plan to hold our laundry wash and dry's where we pay for the laundry customers in the laundromat over a several hour period. While we do these events, we have an opportunity to talk with people and get to know them, building potential relationships.

We plan to set up our prayer tent at the ABC Classic Weekend and also at the Heather's Kup fundraiser. In the prayer tent we offer nothing more than an opportunity for people who are seeking relief the chance to ask somebody to pray for them and their situation. NO STRINGS ATTACHED. We have offered the Thanksgiving meal for many years but for the third time we have offered it as a takeout only meal. This was originally planned to give people who have nobody to share their thanksgiving with or is unable to prepare a thanksgiving meal on their own a place to go and share a meal and conversation. But these past three years we have offered it as a takeout only due to the fears of Covid. My prayer is to be able to resume eating the meals in the fellowship hall, but my fear is that we will not have enough room to seat the number of people we have been feeding over the past years.

As mentioned, Celebrate Recovery continues to meet on Monday nights. Celebrate Recovery is not just for people dealing with addictions or abuse. If you are struggling with any type of struggle, Celebrate Recovery is a place where you can come and share your struggles with others who are also recovering and struggling with the situation's life has confronted them with. It is our hope that those in attendance will find the healing they need and the recovery they desire.

Finally, we continue to offer our Christmas blessings; offering assistance to families who are in need in our area. This year we planned to assist two families; however, the second family backed out before thanksgiving. We also continue to bless the orchard workers who work at the Ridgetop orchards. We have been helping people who have run into tough circumstances by offering them assistance in meeting needs for shelter, help with utility bills, and even people in need for transportation. In all of the things we do, our goal is not to bring them in and make them a part of our congregation; although we would love that. Our goal is to share the love of Jesus to each one; and remind them they are also part of the family of God.

Looking for Improvement

We can look at these numbers and get an idea of how we are doing, but the real question is how can we improve. And the answers each year look very much the same. Demonstrate your commitment to our Lord and Savior by attending weekly services; if not in person, then participate on line and leave us a note letting us know that you have attended, include the names of those who watch with you if there are others, which we will count. My goal is to have each person who is on our attendance list participate in Sunday worship at least 50% of the time with the majority in attendance 85% of the Sundays.

If you are not currently a part of a discipleship opportunity in the form of a small group or Sunday School class, I urge you to become engaged in one depending on what is available and what times you have available. If you cannot find one that meets your schedule, find another person who would be willing and start your own small group. These are ways that you are able to be discipled or assist in the discipleship of others.

We are always looking for persons to help with our children's ministries. Get your background checks completed, and sign up to become a part of our children's ministries. Whether it is working in the nursery, volunteering a month in children's church, or helping to teach in Sunday school, VBS, or even on Wednesday evenings; there is always someplace where you can serve if you are willing. If you are not comfortable working with children, perhaps there is a place where you can get involved with adult ministries, whether it is in men's ministry, women's ministry, we are always looking for fresh ideas. If you don't see something that could take part in, perhaps you have an idea for a new group this is how the ministries of the church begin, when one person sees a need and takes the steps to meet it.

Challenge

We can attend services and small groups every time they are offered; but if we are not making progress spiritually, then we as a church and individuals are failing. I challenge each of you, as well as myself, to take the necessary steps to draw deeper into the word of Lord. Study your bibles; draw close to the Lord in prayer, established devotional times, and seek the Lord and His guidance in all you do. Listen closely for His still small voice, and be obedient to what you are being told. Many times, the blessings we receive are the result of the grace we are given when we step out in faith and attempt what we do not think is possible. I urge you to become more involved in the ministries of this church, without you there is much missing. Engage in the fellowship activities that are offered. Take an active role in discipleship, seeking the spiritual growth we need, sharing what the Lord has done in your life, and teaching others how they may see the hand of the Lord in their own lives.

I leave you with 1 Peter 1:8-16, "⁽⁸⁾Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, ⁽⁹⁾for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls. ⁽¹⁰⁾Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied of the grace that was to be yours made careful search and inquiry, ⁽¹¹⁾inquirng about the person or time that the Spirit of Christ within them indicated when it testified in advance to the sufferings destined for Christ and the subsequent glory. ⁽¹²⁾It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in regard to the things that have now been announced to you through those who brought you good news by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven--things into which angels long to look! ⁽¹³⁾Therefore prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed. ⁽¹⁴⁾Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you formerly had in ignorance. ⁽¹⁵⁾Instead, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; ⁽¹⁶⁾for it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ^{1 Peter 1:8-16 NRSV}

Today, and in the year to come, I pray that each of us would seek the will of our Lord and not be distracted by the events of this world; that we may focus our attention on our relationship with Jesus and the hope we have in Him; working to build His kingdom in our communities.

I want to begin my letter by saying thank you. Thank you for welcoming me and my family into this church, with open arms. Thank you for loving our children. Thank you for electing me to the church board, and trusting me to help guide the church into the future. In a world that is harsh, unforgiving, and closed-off, being somewhere that is open, welcoming, and caring is refreshing and needed.

After being elected to the church board, I was approached about taking the post of Board Secretary, which I happily accepted. In this position, I had the ability to see all of the wonderful things that the church does, both within our walls and out in the community. To say that I was amazed at the number of things that this church does, is an understatement. Mark 16:15 tells us to "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." Though it's not always preaching from behind a pulpit, I believe that we find ways to "preach" the gospel all throughout the community.

Throughout the past year we have done a plethora of good things, and here are some of the highlights. Some of those projects included: upgrading multiple pieces of church technology, tarring and chipping the parking lot, upgrading the sound booth, fixing the pavilion, and purchasing new AC units. We also did fun things together, like Family-Fun Night, Craft Night, wrapping Christmas presents, Men's movie night, Wednesday Evening Small Groups, Women's Retreat, and numerous youth events.

Overall, it was a busy, but wonderful year. I think that we, as a church, were able to do God's work and spread His message, while also having a lot of fun along the way.

As I conclude my first letter to the church, I want to encourage you to try something new in 2023. If you read some things that sound like you would enjoy, try them. A church is not an elite club of a couple people doing the same things over and over, but a group of people that step out of their comfort zones to do God's work. Ryot Church of the Nazarene SDMI & Special Ministries Report 2022 - Year End Report



This report will cover the SDMI as well as Special Ministries.

Special Ministries Committee meets every other month beginning in January to schedule events. The Committee is made up of the Pastor, leaders from SDMI, NMI, NYI, Children's Ministry, Men's and Ladies Ministries, as well as others in our church. This past year there were 10 people on the committee, with an average meeting attendance of 5.

The Committee schedules and plans all church fellowships. At the meetings, we address issues and organize events for SDMI, Children's Ministry, Kindness Outreach, Men's and Ladies Ministries, NMI, and NYI. This includes Easter Events, The Block Party, and all Kindness Outreach Activities. An Outreach is scheduled every other month.

We also discuss the ministry of our church with regards to being FED. Our focus is to schedule events to promote closer friendships and outreach. We have numerous opportunities for the congregation to participate throughout each month, like Breakfast at Denny's, Church Workday, Craft Night, and Family Fun Night. This year we have planned a covered dish Fellowship Meal for each month that has 5 Sundays, excluding December. The meals will be held on January 29, April 30, July 30, and October 29.

Thank you to those who make up our Committee and faithfully attend planning meetings. Thank you for giving up your free time, for sharing your ideas and assisting in the planning. Thank you to those who are not on our Committee but diligently work behind the scenes.

For a SDMI report, on average our attendance for Morning Worship is 80. We average only 33 people in Sunday School.

We have purchased a new curriculum which we began using in August. We have also restructured our class rooms to better fit the ages of our kids. We now have a Preteen Class which Jan will be teaching. The lessons begin in Children's Church and then are continued into Sunday School, with the kids splitting into their individual classrooms.

Beginning today, our nursery class will follow a shortened curriculum as well.

Last year the Church Board along with Brotherhood Mutual worked on and then passed a Protection from Abuse Policy. This policy includes but is not limited to clearance requirements for volunteers, rules for conduct of volunteers, and what to do in the case of alleged abuse. A copy of our Protection Policy is now available on the church website @ryotnazarene.org.

We were also advised on changes that were needed for Permission Slips and Activity forms. Those changes were made and passed with Board approval.

Ryot Church of the Nazarene NMI 2022 - Year End Report



Although we do not have an NMI Leader at this time, our church has remained active with Missions in the past year.

Our Adult Sunday School Class sponsored three children this year with a total of \$1260.00. The bulletin board in our foyer has more information on our child sponsorship as well as other missionaries that we have connection with.

The Adult Coffee Shop has donated \$453.39 to a Clean Water Fund.

We collected various offerings towards Missions as well. We collected two Alabaster Offerings which are used to fund land purchasing and building construction needs in the Nazarene Mission Areas. This year our Alabaster Offerings totaled \$ 1278.39. We collected an Easter Offering that totaled \$1585 and a Thanksgiving Offering in the amount of \$1350. We also collected a Faith Promise from individuals in the church. This involves making a pledge/promise of a faithful offering weekly, monthly, or yearly and following through. The total collected in 2021 was \$6204.

Also, we participated with offerings for the Bible School Project, \$263.61; and the Teen Special, \$500; and the Adult Special, \$500.

Even though we have done quite well in our outreach, we continue to search for an NMI Leader. If anyone is interested, please contact the pastor.

We also sent \$85 in to the Jesus Film and \$50 to World Mission Radio; and \$200 to District Missionary Care.



Much like the year before it, 2022 has proven to be a challenging year. While the shadow of COVID has largely faded, we are still dealing with its aftermath. The culture, as a whole, has "re prioritized" out attention away from the church and our teens have as well.

Overall, I consider 2022 a success. We filled and hid Easter eggs, helped at Bible school, and decorated the church for Christmas. We took part in other outreaches such as the Gas Buy Down which is part of the larger church's outreach. We also assisted during the Block Party. We did this with a much smaller NYI and with two of our members attending college.

It wasn't all work as the NYI had some fun as well in 2022 starting the year off with a Super Bowl Party and ending with our NYI Christmas party (attended by 10 teens !!!). In between we attended Mission Advance where our teens helped to package 10,000 meals in about an hour's time with the other district teens. We attended the Bedford Village's Murder Mystery Night and had our NYI Christmas Lunch after decorating the church.

For our Wednesday night meeting, we have started a brand-new curriculum. The current topic is Truth which has led to some fairly fruitful discussions.

Moving forward, I believe my goal has remained to encourage the NYI to become engaged and involved with the church and to be the example. I have "opened" our events and meetings and encouraged our teens to invite a friend. And they have on several occasions. Further I encourage the adults, young and old, to become engaged with our teens. Invest some time and disciple them as they are hungry for it. I also encourage any of our teens who do not regularly attend to do so. Come give it a try, you may be surprised how much fun it can be. The old adage "it takes a village" cannot be truer as it takes the entire church (parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and everyone else) to pour into our youth. We need to, once again, prioritize the church and prioritize our youth.

This past year we have completed the following projects and maintenance.

- Cleaned the red shed out and took unneeded items to Love INC

- Repaired the sinking posts in the pavilion
- Removed the stone and replaced with mulch at the entrance of the church
- Clean up grounds removing debris and sweeping parking lot
- Installed shelving in balcony area
- Installed an outside water hydrant/faucet to the pavilion
- Had gravel parking areas tar and chipped
- Increased the area around the fire ring at the pavilion

Ryot Church of the Nazarene Church Treasurer's 2022 End of Year Report



This year came with unprecedented amount of devastation in our small community. Last winter, the Garman family lost their barn and cattle to a devastating fire. Just after that, another fire destroyed the home of a close friend to several in our church family. Then in the summer, the epidemic of fires affected our own church family. Soon after that, a young man that attended our church as a teen was tragically killed in a car accident while his girlfriend continues to adjust to the changes in her life. Another fire ripped through the Nazarene Church in Windber. These all were life altering events that impacted so many people that our church has ties to.

These were the situations that we publicly tried to support as a congregation. This year, we collected over \$8,000 in love offerings. There are also so many private requests that Pastor Kevin handles. This year, our church distributed \$17,000 in supporting our community in various times of need.

This is what we are called to do. Matthew 25:34-36 says "³⁴" Then the King will speak to those on his right. He will say, 'My Father has blessed you. Come and take what is yours. It is the kingdom prepared for you since the world was created. ³⁵I was hungry. And you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty. And you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger. And you invited me in. ³⁶I needed clothes. And you gave them to me. I was sick. And you took care of me. I was in prison. And you came to visit me.""

Outreach has always been and continues to be a top priority of our church. Looking into next year, we are budgeting 10,000 for local benevolence – to make sure we have a means of helping when the situations arise.

In 2022, we were fortunate to be able to avoid any major repair expense. We were able to make the repairs the pavilion and installed a waterline. We had gravel lot and the parking lot at the fellowship hall tar and chipped. The funds were pulled from our operating account and savings account – we did not need to access any of our long-term CD's to have this completed.

The 2023 budget does not anticipate any major expenses – however, we did substantially increase our budget for all utility expenses.
